















F.G. MILLER'S FIRST SHOWING OF HANDBALL




















The Junior Girls defeated Glen Avon to win their County Cup. Angel Ference coached in place of Steve Krankowsky who took ill at the start of the season.

The school received tremendous support from the community businesses and individuals for the awards. A big thanks to all our sponsors.



After the performance, growling tummies directed the bus drivers to Mc Donald's before we hit the road back to Elk Point.







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





















Skiing Marmot Basin



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
BASKETBALL BACKBOARD FURIDRAISES


