This, the 32nd edition of the Wapiti is dedicated to the memory of Clayton Orr who would have participated in the Class of '94 ceremonies.














Red Thunder Dance Troupe










New Banner Unveiled!


November 18, 1993
























#### **Editor's Message**

Joni ,who is 14 now, has been competing for 3 years and as of June 1994 she has received a total of 77 medals (56 gold, 8 silver, and 13 bronze) in her events the 100 m, 200 m, 300 m, 400 m, triple jump and long jump at the Midget level. She has set provincial records in long jump (14 & under) at 5.28 m (her personal best), and triple jump (16 & under) at 10.84 m (her personal best is 11.01 m). At the 1993 Nationals she brought home a gold in long jump, bronze in 400 m, and bronze in the medley relay. Joni, who was nominated Alberta female midget Athlete of the year in 1993, has personal bests of 13 sec - 100 m, 26.4 sec - 200 m, 42.8 sec - 300 m, and 59.52 sec - 400 m.

All of us here at F. G. Miller would like to congratulate you, Joni, you'll always be a Crusader even when you reach the gold podium at the Olympics






