



He has always been interested in the affairs of the Union and has very often been instrumental in the success and smooth operation of these ventures.


#### PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE







#### SPORTS CONVENOR'S REPORT

This year the students participated in a variety of sports. These included volleyball, basketball, curling, badminton, track and field, softball, and hardball.

Our girls' and boys' volleyball teams were very strong this year, winning a majority of their games. In the St. Paul tournament for the County Cup. both teams were defeated, but not before they gave St. Paul a run for their money.

In curling our girls' team managed to reach the playoffs in Edmonton, where unfortunately they lost.

Basketball started out strong and there was good fan support. The girls went through the season with only three losses--all to St. Paul. They finished second in the league and the boys third. Our junior teams also did well. At our invitational tournament both the boys and girls took first place. They also played for the County Cup but were defeated.

An added feature was the introduction of the "Easthope Challenge Cup". The senior boys won it for volleyball, however, the teachers surprised everyone by winning it for curling and basketball.

In badminton, six people went to Lloydminister. They played well, but all lost out.

Interest in track and field really grew this year. We had a big strong team. In Mallaig the boys won the trophy with a good forty points over their nearest rivals -- St. Paul. The girls finished second. At the track meet in Lloyd. five qualified to go to the provincials where unfortunately all lost out.

#### Track And Field Meet In Mallaig



#### VALEDICTORY

Master of Ceremonies, Parents, Fellow Students, Honored Guests: The theme for our Graduation is "Happiness is Being Together". For many of us, the full depth of this feeling will not be apparent until years later, when we look back upon our school years with somewhat altered attitudes. With the added confidence, and sense of responsibility that accompanies maturity, we will realize that many of our present doubts and insecurities were trivial and often even absurd. Hopefully, the feelings of resentment toward authority and toward the conforming to rules will diminish and be replaced by an understanding that a developmental system of education must imply some restrictions in personal freedom. Indeed, the twelve or so years that we have spent in school should have given us some preparation for the roles we will play in society as young adults. Our future successes or failures, whether in the eyes of society or simply our own, will be determined to a large extent by the "schooling" that our parents and teachers have given us.

This graduation ceremony is a measure of recognition of the completion of one phase of our learning. To say that our present level of learning is adequate or complete is false, for unless we acquire something new every day for the rest of our lives, we are extracting nothing from life and contributing less to it. We must live to learn, and conversely, learn to live. And to live to the fullest, we must set high personal goals and derive satisfaction from their fulfillment. But in the search for happiness we must not become absorbed with selfishness, and accordingly neglect or inhibit the rights and needs of our fellow men. It is from lack of social awareness that our universal problems such as racial prejudice, poverty, and religious conflict have evolved. We must remember that every person, in some way, helps to make the universe complete. Thus, before we are tempted to devote all of our energy and time to the pursuit of our own happiness we should acknowledge the rights of others to a full and satisfying existence. Likewise we must be sensitive to the needs and welfare of future generations. Problems such as pollution, and depletion of natural resources, which only recently began to cause the least stir of anxiety, will soon be crucial situations if not dealt with properly and effectively.

These and other problems will become as much our concern as they have been our parents! Moments of decision will be forced upon us and the issues and pressures of a competitive and often unkind society will become apparent. When we have passed this test of maturity the world will be ours to inherit and its destiny will be ours to direct. The guidance and morals that our parents and teachers have given us will affect not only the direction of our lives but will ultimately touch the lives of our children and our children's children.

The graduands have long and eagerly anticipated graduation, but now that it is near reality, we are experiencing an unexpected sadness, a feeling of regret that departure from accustomed patterns is eminent. It is not easy to bid farewell to fellow students, but this is necessary for our paths in the mobile Canadian society must be widely divergent. Our thoughts, too, embrace parents and teachers, for their encouragement and support have contributed in no small measure to the accomplishment of this occasion. There will, of course, be pictures and photographs to portray our involvement here today, but these will not be necessary, for in our hearts we can never be separated, in reminiscence, we will remain close. In our memories, the happiness of our shared accomplishments and experiences will forever be cherished.
