







This yearbook is dedicated to Mr. Grant Samuelson,

Mr. Samuelson served this school for a number of years and his absense will be regrettably noticed.






PRINCIPAL'S REMARKS


In closing I would like to express my appreciation to Mr. Uniat for all the time and effort he has put into our union, as he rarely hears a thank you.

Master of Ceremonies, Parents, Fellow Students, Ladies and Gentlemen:


"Desiderata" means literally, "those things desired as essential."

hard at learning for the past twelve years, so they have worked
hard teaching. ut we must continue learning so that we will be
able to pass the profits of our experiences on to others also.
That is the part we must play in our society, to enjoy our experiences
to learn through them, and pass the benefits on to others.

Graduation is the time for good-byes. It should be a time for thank-vou's. So the Graduating Class of 1975 would like to say "Thank You", to parents, teachers, family and friends. On this, our Graduation, may we say thank you for the challenge to grow. for the encouragement to compete, for the determination to succeed, for the enthusiasm to live, for the desire to understand for the ability to love, for the eagerness to share, for the opportunity to learn.
