


_ Principal's Message



President's Message


PRESIDENTS MESSAGE

SENIOR GIRLS VOLLEYBALL



The 10 girls played exceptionally hard and finished in 4th place in the league standings. The highlight of their season was when they lost out to Iron River in the semi-finals at the Bonnyville tournament. This bright spot indicates good things to come for the junoir girls team.

The boys, though small in numbers, played to the best of their ability and finished 5th in league standings. Like the girls team, the highlight of the year was the Bonnyville tournament where they were narrowly beaten in the finals. Better luck next year.





As you can see, the year was very successful and they had fun!















I would like to read a few words of encouragement in the form of a poem:


